Competition Information

Competition Dates:

March 27 and 28, 2010

Entry Form Deadline:

February 22, 2010

Late entries, if accepted, must pay double. No entries will be accepted after March 1, 2010. We ask that team coaches please check to see that all of the information on the entry is correct before mailing. The team coach must sign all entry forms to verify that all information is true and correct. All skater memberships and test levels will be verified. Inaccurate and/or incomplete forms will be returned. There will be a \$10 fee for each change made to the entry form.

Eligibility:

Skaters entering the competition must be registered individual or professional members of ISI, as of February 22, 2010. Skaters may not participate without a current ISI membership. Competitors must skate at their highest test level registered with the ISI national office by February 22, 2010.

Rules:

The competition will be conducted in accordance with the new 2010 Rule Revisions that were recently announced. Please see the information on the attached pages. All other event rules follow the current guidelines in the 2010 skaters and coaches handbook and the judges manual.

Schedule of Events:

A schedule of events will be sent to each participating rink.

Judging:

All coaches must have current ISI Professional membership and judging certification (and updated tests) that correlates to the level that they are volunteering to judge. All memberships and judging certifications will be verified through the ISI office. Coaches not confirmed eligible by March 1, 2010 will not be able to put their skaters on the ice. All coaches who are not certified will be charged \$35 for a coaching credential.

Age Groups:

Age groups will be determined by the number of entries in each category.

Registration:

A registration desk will be at the entrance to the ice arena on the days of the competition. All competitors must check in at the registration desk 45 minutes prior to their scheduled event. If the competition is running ahead of schedule some events may begin up to 15 minutes early.

Music:

CD's must be turned into the registration desk. Please make sure CD's are clearly labeled with the skater's name and event. Only one song per CD and don't forget a back up.

Awards:

For individual, Partner and Group Events, the following team points will be given:

1 st Place	5 Points for placement + 1 participation point
2 nd Place	4 Points for placement + 1 participation point
3 rd Place	3 Points for placement + 1 participation point
4 th Place	2 Points for placement + 1 participation point
5 th Place	1 Point for placement + 1 participation point
6 th Place	1 participation point

For these team events-Production, Pattern, Synchronized Teams, Kaleidoskate and Team Compulsories, The following team points will be given:

1 st Place	5 Points for placement + 5 participation point
2 nd Place	4 Points for placement + 5 participation point
3 rd Place	3 Points for placement + 5 participation point
4 th Place	2 Points for placement + 5 participation point
5 th Place	1 Point for placement + 5 participation point
6 th Place	5 participation point

The team that accumulates the most points will be declared the winner of the 2010 ICETOWN Riverside Orange Twist Open. All individual awards will be given after the posting of the results of each event. Team awards will be given at the conclusion of the competition.

Accounting Review:

An ISI professional member can make accounting review requests to the Competition Director. Since all marks given by the judges are considered final, a review is simply a verification of the scores. Never, under any circumstances, are videotapes referred to for an event in question. A \$50.00 fee will be charged for each review. If an error is found, the fee will be refunded.

Interpretive: Music for all levels will be provided. Skaters may not be coached by instructors, parents, or anyone else during this event. Music will be played at least twice during warm-up.

New Maneuver Limitations are:

Tots-Delta	Can do maneuvers from FS 1 and below
FS 1-3	Can do maneuvers from FS 4 and below
FS 4-5	Can do maneuvers from FS 6 and below
FS 6-10	Can do any maneuvers

Tots: Tots must be 5 years old or under as of February 22, 2010. Programs will be 1 minute in length and must include the required test maneuvers from their level.

Pre-Alpha: Routines MUST include one additional maneuver from Freestyle 1.

Freestyle 3 and 4: For the safety of all skaters, backward arabesques are not permitted during the warm-up.

Artistic Skating: Open to all skaters Freestyle 1 and above. There are NO required moves. Emphasis should be placed on the creative and innovative design of the skating program. Strong edges, body positions, flow, musical interpretation, rhythm, choreography, and artistry should be the focus of the program. There is NO score for technical merit. Props are not permitted in this event. The program length is 1 _ minutes for FS 1-5 and 2 minutes for FS 6 and up.

New Maneuver Limitations are:

FS 1-3	Can do maneuvers from FS 4 and below
FS 4-5	Can do maneuvers from FS 6 and below
FS 6-10	Can do any maneuvers

Spotlight character solo: Individual skaters portray a famous, easily identifiable character, through the use of music, costume, props (optional), and actions. Opportunity exists here for the skater to be creative, original, and exciting.

Spotlight Dramatic Solo: An artistic theatrical performance by an individual skater that invokes an emotional response from the judges and audience. The skater's interpretation should create a mood that is enhanced by style, creativity, costuming, and props (optional). The overall impression at the conclusion of the performance should be that it was dramatic.

Spotlight Light Entertainment Solo: To entertain in a refreshing, light hearted fashion using music, costume, props (optional), comedy, dance and skating moves.

Spotlight Solo Duration:

Low	Tots-Delta	1 minute
Medium	FS 1-3	1 _ minutes
Intermediate	FS 4-5	1 _ minutes
High	FS 6-10	2 minutes

Spotlight couples: Two skaters performing a routine together that is entertaining, emotional, or portrays a character using costumes and props (optional). This event is divided into Low, Medium, Intermediate, and High levels.

Spotlight Couples Duration:

Low	Tots-Delta	1 minute
Medium	FS 1-3	1 _ minutes
Intermediate	FS 4-5	1 _ minutes
High	FS 6-10	2 minutes

Family Spotlight: This event is open to two or more FAMILY MEMBERS of any age and level. Program time is 1 _ minutes

Spotlight Program Duration and Prop Specifications: Timing for all spotlight routines begins when any action starts, not to exceed 15 seconds after the music begins. The penalty grade of 2.0 will be given to the skater under the costume and prop score for exceeding the prop specifications. The penalty grade will be given for:

*Altering the ice with substances such as shaving cream, whipped cream, etc.

*Exceeding the 30 seconds allowed for set up

*Exceeding the 30 seconds allowed for leaving the ice.

*Exceeding the size guidelines for props, such as a skater not being able to hand carry, push or lift the prop onto the ice alone. (Entrances to the ice vary greatly from rink to rink, so plan your props accordingly.)

Spotlight Limitation on Moves: The penalty for not following the limitation on moves the skater may perform during the spotlight event will be the grade of 2.0 for music and choreography.

*Skaters in Tots-Delta are permitted to perform maneuvers from Freestyle 1 level or lower

*Skaters in Freestyle 1-3 are permitted to perform maneuvers from Freestyle 4 level or lower, and any uncaptured moves from these levels.

*Skaters in Freestyle 4-5 are permitted to perform maneuvers from Freestyle 6 level or lower, and any uncaptured moves from these levels.

*Skaters in Freestyle 6-10 may perform maneuvers from any level as well as any uncaptured moves.

Production Number: This event is for 8 or more skaters and is for your entire skating team, regardless of skating skill level. Music should be 3-4 _ minutes. The program should be a lavishly creative artistic work, marked by extreme freedom of style and structure. Costumes and props should illustrate the program. Any and all types of skating maneuvers are permitted. Teams have 30 seconds to enter and exit the ice surface. If 33 or more skaters are involved, the team will be listed as a Production Extravaganza.

****Synchronized Skating and Synchronized Formation**** The 5 basic elements: block, circle, line, wheel, and intersections will be added in both events as separate judge criteria score.

Synchronized Formation: A group of 8-24 skaters performing in unison. Using unique combinations of circles, pinwheels, kick lines, matching steps, and interesting footwork of their choice. The program should interpret the music.

Synchronized Skating: A group of 8-24 skaters in unison, performing for technically difficult steps than Synchronized Formation. The program should interpret the music.

Jump Team A: The team will consist of six skaters. All team members must not have passed freestyle 4. Each skater will perform one jump twice. The best attempt will be judged. No music. The jumps will be Half Flip, Half Lutz, Ballet Jump, Waltz Jump, Salchow, and Toe Loop.

Jump Team B: The team will consist of six skaters. Skaters may be any test level. Each skater will perform on jump twice. The best attempt will be judged. No music. The jumps will be Loop, Flip, Lutz, Split, Axel, and Double Salchow.

Spin Team A: The team will consist of six skaters. All team members must not have passed freestyle 4. Each skater will perform one spin twice. The best attempt will be judged. No Music. The spins will be Two Foot, One Foot (free leg at side), Scratch, Attitude, Change Foot, and Sit.

Spin Team B: The team will consist of six skaters. Skaters may be any test level. Each skater will perform on spin twice. The best attempt will be judged. No music. The spins will be Sit, Camel, Flying Camel,

Layback, Back Scratch and Combination Spin consisting of one change of foot and three different positions i.e. camel, layback, back sit.

Freestyle Synchro teams: Synchro teams are open to 3-7 skaters that perform a synchronized program at a Freestyle level. All skaters must have passed the Freestyle test for the corresponding Synchro level that they are competing in. Skating above or below the skaters' test level is not allowed. Every skater is to perform every maneuver at the particular Freestyle level including the dance step sequence in unison. Props are not allowed in this event.

Team Compulsories: This event is open to teams of Freestyle levels only. A skater may not skate below his/her test level registered with the ISI Headquarters Office. A skater may skate over his/her test level. Pre-Alpha through Delta skaters may participate in the team compulsory event. A team consists of 6 skaters, any age, male and/or female. Only one maneuver per skater can be performed. The teams will be divided into the following age groupings: Majority of skaters 20 and under or majority of skaters 21 and over.

Compulsory Moves: Open to skaters of all levels. Each skater will perform three prescribed maneuvers from their test level. Maneuvers may be performed in any order, in a "mini" program with no music. A minimum amount of connecting steps will be allowed, however there is no grade given for these connecting moves. This is an opportunity to introduce the experience of a competition to the beginning skater. This event will be performed on full ice.

Open Freestyle:

Bronze: Open to Freestyle 1-3 skaters and ISI Bronze level skaters.
Can do any maneuvers from FS 3 and below.
Programs are 2 minutes in length.

Silver: Open to Freestyle 4-5 skaters and ISI Silver level skaters.
Can do any maneuvers from Freestyle 5 and below.
Programs are 2 minutes in length.

Gold: Open to Freestyle 5-6 skaters and ISI Silver level skaters.
Can do any maneuvers from Freestyle 6 and below.
Programs are 3 minutes in length.

Platinum: Open to Freestyle 7-10 skaters and ISI Silver level skaters.
Can do any skating maneuvers.
Programs are 4 minutes in length.

TOT 1	Proper way to fall, proper way to get up, march while moving
TOT 2	two-foot jump, swizzle standing still, beginning two-foot glide
TOT 3	Preparation for snowplow, dip, forward swizzle
TOT 4	Backward swizzle, backward wiggle, two foot or one-foot snowplow stop
Pre-Alpha	Two-foot glide, one-foot glide (either foot), forward swizzles
Alpha	Forward stroking, right over left forward crossovers, one-foot snowplow
Beta	Right over left backward crossovers, backward stroking, tight T-stop
Gamma	Right outside three turn, right mohawk combination, hockey stop
Delta	Right inside three turn, bunny hop, lunge
FS 1	Waltz jump, one-half flip, two-foot spin
FS 2	Ballet Jump, one-foot spin, half lutz
FS 3	Salchow, change foot spin, backward pivot
FS 4	Flip jump, one-half loop jump, sit spin
FS 5	Fast back scratch spin, axel, camel spin
FS 6	Split falling leaf, layback, double salchow
FS 7	Double toe loop, flying camel, two walley jumps
FS 8	Double loop, split lutz, flying sit spin
FS 9	Double flip, double lutz, axel-double loop combination
FS 10	Death Drop, triple edge jump, four alternating axels.
